

3rd CIH Summer School "Teaching interventions crossing borders"

August 28th – September 1st 2017 in Munich, Germany



Focus: Teaching Intervention in Medicine

Application deadline: 28th of February, 2017

Background

The Center for International Health (CIH) is one of five Centers of Excellence in Higher Education in Development Cooperation funded by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development within the German Academic Exchange Services' exceed program. It aspires to meet health-related challenges through capacity building in training and research. Its vision is to empower health professionals around the globe.

In this context, CIH identified that while many epidemiological studies are carried out across the world to identify risk factors for certain diseases, only a few of them take the next step in the research cycle and develop interventions in order to implement the identified prevention strategies. This problem is common in e.g., public, occupational and environmental health. One method for such interventions is the use of innovative teaching methods in order to train the population affected and let them make informed decisions.

Learning objectives

After active participation in the course, participants will be able to:

- ✓ Identify the need for intervention based on the results of epidemiological studies
- ✓ Identify the most suitable target population for the intervention
- ✓ Develop a comprehensive structured concept for the intervention
- ✓ Develop appropriate learning objectives for the intervention
- ✓ Plan the content and structure of teaching sessions using modern teaching methods
- ✓ Implement the proposed interventions in their home countries
- ✓ Evaluate the success of the interventions
- ✓ Work in a global network of practitioners, researchers and health care workers

**This course is held in English. Therefore, fluency in English is required.
Knowledge of English will be checked prior to admission during a Skype interview!**

Target Group

Physicians and other health specialists currently working or currently being trained in low- or middle-income countries.

Please note that all participants are required to bring a medical or public health related problem that they encounter during their work in their home countries, for which they aspire to develop an intervention using the teaching methods that will be thought to them throughout the course of the summer school.

Teaching methods

The course aims to initiate an active participatory learning process. It uses a mixture of:

- Presentations and interactive group work
- Interactive lectures and group discussions
- Individual presentations by participants with peer evaluation
- Project-based learning with real life problems
- Demonstrations and Games
- Further Methods from the “Munich Methods Box”

Key facts and concepts are addressed in interactive lectures. Readings add practical skills and contribute to a better understanding and process analyses. The development of relevant skills is supported by tutored group work and group presentations. Each participant will work on his/her own project to maximize the learning outcome!

Duration / Certification

- 5 days / 45 hours. 100% attendance is required
- All participants receive a certificate of attendance upon successful completion of the course
- This Summer School is accredited with 5 ECTS points

Course Fee

- Registration fee **€ 500**
- Tuition fee **€ 250**
- Lodging at student housing **€ 250**

The registration and tuition fee cover coursework, coffee breaks, lunch and printed materials. It does not include accommodation in Munich, transportation within Germany, international transportation to and from Munich, insurance or other personal living costs during the stay.

Scholarships

A limited number of scholarships are available for participants who are being trained or who have been trained in low and middle income countries. Scholarships will be given to eligible participants based on their application forms and their Skype Interviews.
